Winner's Jersey

A traditional part of the famous Tour de France cycling race is the wearing of a special jersey to signify the accomplishments of certain riders during the race.

Find out which jersey is awarded for each accomplishment listed below.

Jersey

Description



In the race, sprint points are awarded to riders based on their finish in the different stages, their performance in time trials and how well they do in sprints along the way. The overall point leader after each stage gets this colour jersey.



The best performance in the youth division (under 25) earns this jersey for each stage.



The overall race leader wears this jersey to help spectators pick out the leader. This is decided by totaling the time each rider takes on the daily stage. The rider with the lowest overall time at the end of each stage receives this ceremonial jersey.



The rider designated as the best climber during the mountainous stages wears this distinctive jersey. It is awarded based on a point system recognizing performance in the toughest climbs.
